

Practical training of tidal current observation

The training programme includes lectures on offshore oceanography, wind waves, chemistry of sea water, oceanographic data management, computer programming, tides and tidal currents, etc. as well as practical training in oceanographic observation on board Survey Vessel SHOYO and tide and tidal current observation using Survey Vessel KAIYO.

Group Training Courses in 1986
