now exposed to various survey instruments, survey methods and procedures in the field training of harbour and coastal surveys carried out with the cooperation of the Sixth Regional Maritime Safety Headquarters in Hiroshima Port, for one month from July to August. They will also be engaged in the practical training of offshore hydrographic survey aboard the Survey Vessel SHOYO in the southern seas of Japan for about one week in October 1987.

## New Group Training Course in Nautical Charting

A new group training course in nautical charting will be conducted at the Hydrographic Department of Japan under the sponsorship of JICA from this year. This new course will be held every other year alternately with the Physical Oceanographic Survey Course the latter which will, accordingly, be conducted in fiscal 1988. There will be eight seats for the participants from the developing countries. The duration of the course will be about three and a half months.
