

INDIVIDUAL TRAINING AT J.H.D.

An individual training in tidal observation and data processing will be conducted at the Hydrographic Department of Japan for Mr. Ahmad Azman Bin Ghazali, Geodetic Surveyor, Sarawak Branch of Department of Survey and Mapping, Malaysia, for about two months from 8 July to 10 September 1991.

Mr. Azman, who is now responsible for the administration and smooth running of his Geodesy Section as well as the planning and maintenance program of the

tide gauges and tidal data processing, is a counterpart designated for Mr. Takanori IMANISHI, Coastal Survey Officer of J.H.D., dispatched in October 1989 and now assigned at Sarawak Branch of Department of Survey and Mapping, Malaysia, as a JICA expert in tide.
